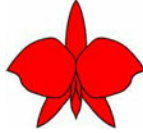

NON-COMPETITIVE EXHIBITS:

As is customary, there will be a 'non-competitive' table for the display of those plants ineligible for competition under the 12 month rule or whose owners do not wish to enter them competitively. Members having such plants are warmly encouraged to offer them for display.

General Notes

1. **Note Registration is now 8.30 am - 10.30 am**
2. It is essential you fill out the attached Registration Form before you submit your plants for registration. Make sure you print all details clearly and accurately. (Spare forms are available to download from the BOS website)
3. You will note on page 2 the Dorset Cup is now awarded to the Best Oncidium and not Odontoglossum. Due to recent changes in nomenclature the genus Odontoglossum no longer exists and therefore all plants with this name should now be called Oncidiums. As this is a recent change the judges will still accept plants labelled Odontoglossum.
4. It is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure their exhibits conform to the Show Schedule and are placed in the correct classes. This applies especially to the group classes 10, 11 & 12. You should also check Class cards, filled out by the registrar, are correct. If in doubt, seek advise from the Show Manager.
5. PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOUR PLANTS ARE FREE FROM PESTS. If necessary get a friend to help you. We are sorry, but plants found to be infected could be disqualified.
6. The usual plea (but as valid as ever): Do please bring as many orchids as possible for the show tables and the non-competitive display, also as many Tombola and Raffle prizes as possible.

SCHEDULE OF COMPETITIVE CLASSES

- Class 1 One Cymbidium species or hybrid – Standard or Miniature
- Class 2 One Slipper Orchid Hybrid (includes Paphiopedilum, Phragmipedium, Cypripedium & Mexipedium)
- Class 3 One Slipper Orchid Species (includes Paphiopedilum, Phragmipedium, Cypripedium & Mexipedium)
- Class 4 One Oncidiinae
- Class 5 One Dendrobium species or hybrid
- Class 6 One Cattleya / Laelia species or hybrid or intergeneric hybrid containing Cattleya or Laelia
- Class 7 One Phalaenopsis species or Hybrid or intergeneric hybrid containing Phalaenopsis
- Class 8 One orchid hybrid not mentioned above (i.e. Classes 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7)
- Class 9 One orchid species not mentioned above (i.e. Classes 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7)
- Class 10 Three different orchid species; may include those mentioned above in Classes 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7
- Class 11 Three different orchid hybrids; may include those mentioned above in Classes 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7
- Class 12 A group of three mixed orchids species and hybrids; may include those mentioned in all Classes above
- Class 13 Novice Class: One orchid species or hybrid. Class restricted to those members who have never been awarded a First at any orchid show.
- Class 14 One cut orchid flower spike in a vase; must not include any foliage or other material
- Class 15 One window-sill orchid. Any orchid species or hybrid which has been grown in the home (excluding plants grown in a Wardian case or similar structure).

THE AWARDS

1. The Echo Cup

Awarded for the plant- species or hybrid – judged to be the best in the show –
(i.e. from Classes 1 to 13 and Class 15).

2. The Species Trophy

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best orchid species in the show -
(i.e. from Classes 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 12, 13, 15)

3. The Dorset Cup

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best species or hybrid Oncidium (formerly Odontoglossum) in the show-
(i.e. from (Classes 4, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15)

Awards continued.

4. The Dendrobium Cup

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best species or hybrid Dendrobium in the show-
(i.e. from Classes 5, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15)

5. The Priory Cup

Awarded for the winner of Class 13 – The Novice Class

6. The Solent Shield

Awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most points in the show- three points for each first place,
two points for each second place and one point for each third place.

7. The Slipper Cup

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best Paphiopedilum, Phragmipedium, Cypripedium & Mexipedium
species or hybrid –
(i.e. from Classes 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15)

8. The Bob Wright Centenary Cup 1894 – 1994

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best orchid hybrid –
(i.e. from Classes 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 15)

9. The New Forest Cup

Awarded for the plants adjudged to be the best group of three – (i.e. from Classes 10, 11, 12,)

10. The Dave Cherry Memorial Cup

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best Phalaenopsis species or hybrid –
(i.e. from Classes 7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15)

11. The Ringwood Cup

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best species or hybrid Cattleya / Laelia, or intergeneric hybrid
containing Cattleya or Laelia – (i.e. from Classes 6, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15)

12. The Hamtun Trophy

Awarded for the plant adjudged to be the best species or hybrid Pleurothallid –
(i.e. from Classes 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15)

13. Cultural Awards

Awarded to the grower of any orchid plant (species or hybrid in Classes 1 to 13 and Class 15), which in the
opinion of the judges reaches a particularly high cultural standard.

COMPETITION RULES

1. Eligibility:

- a) Exhibitors in Classes 1 to 15 must be members of the Society
- b) Any plant entered in Classes 1 to 15 must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 12 months prior to the show.
- c) Any plant entered in Class 15 must have been grown in the home for at least 12 months prior to the show.
Plants grown in Wardian Cases or similar structures are excluded.

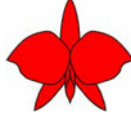
2. Staging:

- a) All exhibits must be registered with the Show Secretary before being placed on the show tables. Please refer to the staging times.
- b) Exhibitors may enter only ONE exhibit in each Class.
- c) No exhibit may be removed from the show tables before the show closes at 4.30 pm.

3. Judging:

The Judges' decisions are final.
